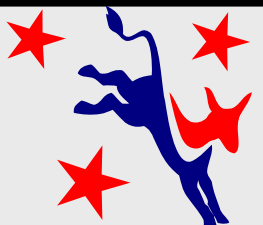

No vote was taken in Northshore School District Position 3 and it's eligible for endorsement again in September.

September Program: Affordable Housing, Planned Density and Livability in NE Seattle

Our September meeting features an overview of Seattle's multifamily upzones in Lake City, Northgate, Roosevelt and the U District urban villages and related HALA and community recommendations for creating and preserving affordable housing .

The panel will help us look into the density aspects of the Seattle 2035 Comprehensive Plan and the HALA recommendations more deeply. We will form our own definitions of livability.

The September meeting is September 17th, 7:30 at The George Community 2212 NE 125th St. in Lake City. Chair Phillip Duggan will be the moderator.

The reason for scheduling affordable housing is the immediate discussion around the HALA recommendations, with emphasis on Northeast Seattle and its urban villages while decisions are being made by the Seattle City Council.

--**Jessica Brand**, the HALA outreach person, will bring the Lake City, Northgate, Roosevelt and U District Comprehensive Plan Urban Design Framework (UDF) with slides of the planned urban village upzones.

--**Mercedes Elizalde** who works for Low-Income Housing Institute, was part of HALA preservation subcommittee as well as the Community Housing Caucus. She will present the HALA recommendations for affordable housing and the community needs.

--**Sandy Motzer** is the president of the Lake City Neighborhood Council which recently presented a workshop examining the HALA recommendations from the neighborhood perspective, including the community's suggestions on livability. She will present the community's thoughts on livability, which wasn't defined by the HALA.

46th LD Treasurer's Report for August 2015:

Betty Means resigned as Treasurer as of August 6th and transferred the books to Phillip Duggan, who turned them over on August 9th to Executive Board Member at-large Julie Anne Kempf, who will be serving as interim acting Treasurer until a permanent Treasurer is recruited and trained.

Unfortunately, Julie Anne's father was stricken with an aortic aneurysm on August 10th and passed away a few days later in that week, so she did not have time to complete an August report. She notified the PDC of the situation so we would effectively remain in compliance (eg. we reported that we did not have an August 2015 report due to this family emergency).

Due to this, the books have held static for the month of August, and the August 2nd report given to Chair Phillip Duggan to present to the Executive Board by Betty Means as her closing report reflected the correct numbers for the date of the August 20th General Meeting. Julie Anne will have an up-to-date report for our next meeting on September 17th.

On a personal note, many thanks to all of you who reached out in so many ways – flowers, cards, calls, letters, texts, facebook messages, hugs, and knowing looks and pats on the arm, etc.. Your messages of hope, healing and focusing on happy memories have been so helpful and treasured during this time. I and my family thank you all for your support.

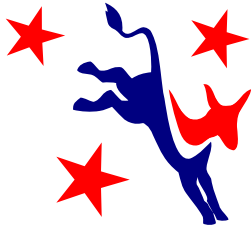
Position	Ballot Measure
No	Initiative Measure No. 1366 concerns state taxes and fees. This measure would decrease the sales tax rate unless the legislature refers to voters a constitutional amendment requiring two-thirds legislative approval or voter approval to raise taxes, and legislative approval for fee increases.
Yes	Initiative Measure No. 1401 concerns trafficking of animal species threatened with extinction. This measure would make selling, purchasing, trading, or distributing certain animal species threatened with extinction, and products containing such species, a gross misdemeanor or class-C felony, with exemptions for certain types of transfers.
Yes	The City of Seattle Initiative Measure Number 122 concerns public participation in government, including publicly-financed election campaigns, and lobbying.
Yes	The City of Seattle's Proposition 1 concerns replacing funding for citywide transportation maintenance and improvements.
Yes	King County Best Starts for Kids is an initiative to improve the health and well-being of King County by investing in prevention and early intervention for children, youth, families, and communities.
