Proposed Rules

1. Sign-in is required at check-in.
2. Eligible voters shall be limited to PCOs that have been certified as being elected during the August 7th, 2012 Primary (including any PCOs who were the only candidate to file in their precinct, and were elected without appearing on a ballot).
 - A. Eligible voters will be issued ballots.
 - B. A 50% + 1 majority vote of members present and voting is necessary to approve any vote.
 - C. If there are more than two candidates and no candidate receives 50% + 1 majority, then the top two candidates will move on to a second ballot.
 - D. Ties will be decided by lot for all races
3. The meeting shall be called to order by the Temporary Chair appointed by King County Democrats.
 - A. The Temporary Chair shall preside until the election of the new Chair.
 - B. The newly elected Chair shall preside immediately after the Chair election results are announced.
4. The Temporary Chair shall review the Proposed Rules with the body.
5. The body shall vote to approve the Proposed meeting Rules.
6. Election of officers shall proceed in the following order:
 - A. Chair
 - B. 1st Vice Chair
 - C. State Committeeman
 - D. State Committeewoman
 - E. KCDCC Male Delegate
 - F. KCDCC Female Delegate
 - G. KCDCC Male Alternate
 - H. KCDCC Female Alternate
 - I. *2nd Vice Chair-Membership*
 - J. *2nd Vice Chair-Outreach*
 - K. *Treasurer*
 - L. *Secretary*
 - M. *Hospitality Chair*
 - N. *Officer At Large (9)*
7. Process for nominating and electing all positions shall include the following:
 - A. Call for nominations – no seconds are required.

- B. Close nominations.
 - C. All candidates will be allotted up to two minutes to be used at candidate's discretion
 - 1. Order of speeches determined by order of nominations.
 - D. Only PCOs can nominate candidates for A-H positions.
 - E. Speakers for all races may be PCOs, candidates, or Democratic residents of the Legislative District.
 - F. Unopposed races may be voted on by a show of hands at the Chair's discretion.
8. Ballot Procedures:
- A. When precinct committee officers vote for organizational officers (e.g., chair, 1st vice chair, secretary, treasurer, state committeepersons), they do not have to vote by signed ballot provided that there is a mechanism to ensure the eligibility of those who cast ballots (e.g., a check-off list, sign-in-sheet, ballot receipts). (WSD Charter – 1/20/2010 – Article VII.G.2)
